9-1-1/Disaster Response Expert Available for Comment

COLUMBUS, Ohio (September 11, 2001)— In response to the tragedy affecting our Nation today, the National Emergency Number Association announces the availability of Dr. Bill Munn for interviews regarding the potential impact of such events on our Nation's 9-1-1 emergency call centers and networks.

"There is nothing of this scale to draw from, but it may be assumed that one impact on emergency response would be a tremendous spike in 9-1-1 calls from citizens calling for information or assurance, apart from reporting actual emergencies," said Munn.

"Of course, emergencies continue, and must be reported, so our concern is on the viability of the total telephone service network and it's ability to continue processing 9-1-1 calls and route them to the appropriate call center," Munn continued.
